Read I Corinthians, Chapter 12, 1-30. In this scripture passage, St. Paul talks about different types of gifts. Paul states, "There are diversities of gifts but the same Spirit. There are differences of ministries but the same Lord. And there are diversities of activities, but it is the same God who works all in all." St. Paul continues by comparing parts of the body to gifts and suggests that members of the body thought *less honorable* should be afforded even *greater honor*. He states, "No, much rather, those members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary. And those members of the body which we think to be less honorable, on these we bestow greater honor; and our unpresentable parts have greater modesty. But our presentable parts have no need. But God composed the body, having given greater honor to that part which lacks it."

Do you believe that St. Paul asserts that all gifts should be respected? Explain. How can you bestow "greater honor" to those individuals who are perceived by others as possessing "less honorable" gifts?
